On Sunday October 11th, four other children (Robinette Ducut, Arleth Gonzalez, Itzel Ocegueva, and Daniel Rodriguez) received their First Communion. On October 25th, I gave Confirmation to ten children. Let's give thanks to God for these children who have received these sacraments and seek blessings on their families!

Archdiocesan Annual Appeal (AAA): Please give whatever you can toward the goal of \$48,719. You have donated so far \$26,341. We still need \$22,378. Please give as early as it's possible for you. If at all possible, please belong to "1% or More Circle" by donating \$500. When the time comes, after we have made the goal, I'll invite the 1% Circle folks to a dinner. The purpose of AAA is to support the ministry and mission of the Archdiocese.

Legion of Mary: I had a meeting last week with the members of Legion of Mary. They felt that at this stage they should continue their prayers and meetings remotely. In the new year, we shall evaluate and see how to proceed.

This Thanksgiving Holiday, No Food Donation: After consultations, I have come to the conclusion that this year, we shall forego the tradition of collecting food on Thanksgiving Day because of concerns of Covid. We shall resume the tradition next year. Please keep in mind that the Mass on Thanksgiving Day---November 26---will be at 9:00 a.m. instead of at 8:00.

New Sound System: I'd like to inform you that, after consultations with our parishioners and the Archdiocese, and after weeks of reflection, I have decided to move forward with the project of a new sound system. Tony Belo will be installing this new sound system for us. He has installed new sound systems in some of the parishes in our Archdiocese as well as in some churches in Europe. It may be completed by the end of the year or early in 2021. I shall keep you posted on the developments of this project.

Advent is Coming Soon: November 29 is First Sunday of Advent.

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest writings, and are driven by his belief and the belief of the entire early Christian community that the return of Christ was imminent, and that devoting time or attention to anything else was foolish.

As time progressed, this fervor subsided a bit. Today we may wonder, when we hear these readings about the coming end-times, if we should take them to heart, if we really believe that Christ still may come upon us as a "thief at night" (1 Thessalonians 5:2). Does this mean that we are to stop our long-range goal-setting, get rid of our yearly calendars and planners, or stop putting money in the college education fund? Of course not. What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel.
