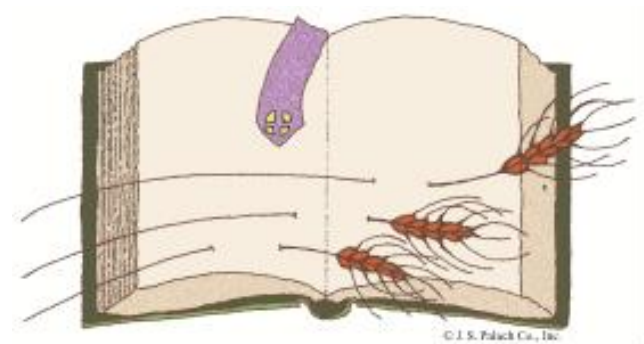


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.

St. Elizabeth Church Services resume on June 20th

We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back to Church! Beginning this coming Saturday, June 20th, we will be celebrating the first Public Mass at the 4:30pm Vigil Mass.

Mandatory Guidelines for the Reopening of the Church:

The **maximum capacity** will be capped at 80 people at each mass.

Please **arrive 15 - 30 minutes prior** to the scheduled mass to allow yourself time to check in and observe the new procedures. If your attendance has not been confirmed and you are waitlisted, you may standby the Church until called.

Registration: You can text/ fax/ call or leave us a message at the parish office - (415) 468-0820, with your 1) name, 2) Cell phone #, 3) time and 4) # of attendees (press 0 to bypass the answering machine to leave a voicemail).

You can also **email us at stelizabetchurchsf@gmail.com**. Register at least 48 business hours ahead. Your registration will be confirmed by a member of the Parish.

Waivers need to be signed prior to attending services (Available at the *parish office Monday - Thursday, 8 am - 12 pm*, via email and at the Church vestibule/ entrance prior to the beginning of each Mass).

Temperature checks prior to entering the church (100 degrees & above will be sent home).

Face masks are mandatory

Sanitizer stations will be available

Please **wait** to be seated

Follow the 6 foot rule. **Social distancing** protocols enforced at all times, unless you live in the same household.

Stay home if you feel ill or show any symptoms.

Dispensation from the Archbishop

The dispensation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in place, and so those who fear becoming infected may remain at home in good conscience. The usual advisories also remain in place for those who should remain at home and avoid exposure to any public gathering, including worship: the elderly, those with pre-existing health conditions making them especially vulnerable to infection, those who have recently had contact with someone tested to be COVID-19 positive, etc.

Sunday, of course, is still the Christian Sabbath and so must be kept holy, even if in-person attendance at Mass is not possible. You may attend any live-streamed Mass in the Archdiocese remotely via the Archdiocesan website.
